Grandparents:

Today, September 8th we celebrate "The Irish National Grandparents Pilgrimage" to Our Lady's Shrine in Knock.



We probably never think about Jesus having grandparents, but he did -- SS Joachim and Anna. When we reflect on this, we get a glimpse of what life was like for Jesus and what family meant to him. Family is important and it is in family that we get our sense of purpose and understanding of who we are.

Jesus Himself, as He grew in age and wisdom and grace, received so much from his grandparents. He listened to the same stories and experiences and was familiar with the same traditions and customs that His Mother Mary heard and saw. He witnessed His grandparents at prayer and maybe even prayed with them. As a grandson He would have seen the affection that His grandfather and grandmother had for each other and He certainly would have known the affection that they had for Him.

That is why grandparents are so important, treasured and loved. They pass on their wisdom, experience and love to another generation. From the point of view of the child, the stories regaled from "the olden days"!!!! can be fascinating and magical. But what is important in the stories is always the elements of faith and good example. Grandchildren marvel at how life was so simple with no Android or Social Media. In fact, they wonder how we all survived... No electricity, no television, bare feet and no running water, how much worse could it be?

When we think of it – if grandparents are telling their children stories and tales and histories and traditions and how it was back in their day and what they endured and enjoyed, well those children are in direct contact with a way of family life that was built of faith and the importance of family.

Pope Francis has said: "The prayer of grandparents and of the elderly is a great gift for the Church, it is a treasure! A great injection of wisdom for the whole of human society: above all for one which is too busy, too taken up, too distracted (Pope Francis Audience 11 March 2015)".

On this day of National Pilgrimage, we remember our own grandparents. If alive, we contact them and tell them how much we love them. If deceased, we remember them in prayer and a kind thought and if convenient stand at their graveside for a moment of reflection.

Today, as we celebrate Grandparent's Day, we read this reflection asking the Lord to hear all our prayers knowing that God cares for us and that, like our grandparents, He may not always give us what we want, but He always gives us what we need.
